HARDEEVILLE HALF MARATHON PRESENTED BY NORTHPOINT MORTGAGE

Updated information 10/6/2025

The Hardeeville Half Marathon presented by Northpoint Mortgage will be held on Sunday, November 9th starting at the Hardeeville School Complex at 150 Hurricane Alley at 7:15 a.m.

The half marathon course is USATF and World Athletics certified as a three loop plus a mile add on at the beginning. The race will also be USATF sanctioned. (See map at Hardeevillehalfmarathon.com). The course records are 1:00:55 for the men (Connor Mantz) and 1:07: 55 for the women (Kiera D'Amato). All miles will be marked in addition to 5k, 10k, 15k, 10m, and 20k. The course is designed to be fast as there is only a six-foot elevation change for the entre course. The start and finish lines are within 43 meters of each other. Packet pickup will be from 1 p.m. to 4 p.m. at the Fairfield Inn in Hardeeville.

Results will be posted on our website at Hardeevillehalfmarathon.com.

There will be water and aid stations at approximately miles 3, 5, 7, 9, and 11miles. If you would like special bottles, please bring your own and we will place them at the tables that you request.

Prize pay-out will be to the top ten for each gender of \$10000 per gender in amounts of \$3.5k, \$1.75k, \$1.25k, \$900, \$\$600, \$500, \$450, \$400, \$350 and \$300.

The field is limited to 200 runners with qualifying times of 1:40 or better. Many of the top runners in the Jasper/Beaufort County area are entered as are several South Carolina top runners including 2024 Olympic Marathon trial qualifiers Jack Mastandrea, Jack Weitzel and James Quattlebaum from Greenville, Esther Atkins from Greenville and Maulden's Victoria Hammersmith. Top Americans scheduled to start include past USATF Half Marathon champion Jacob Thomson from Flagstaff, AZ, and ZAP Endurance athletes (NC) Josh Izewski and Dan Schaffer. Top American women to compete will be Joanna Stephens from Dallas, GA. and ZAP athletes Tristin Colley and Annmarie Tuxbury.

The field will also include several top international runners. Part of the men's field will be Daniel Chaves DeSilva, a past Brazilian Olympian, and sub 1:01 half marathoners from Kenya, Peter Mwanika Njeru and Kipchirchir Saten. Kenya's Bonta Rebita from Bahrain and Tigist Girma from Ethiopia head the women's international field thus far.
